### **Guidance Notes – Grants for First Aid Training**

#### **General:**

The Lord-Lieutenant's Fund was established in 2006, as part of the 50th Anniversary celebrations of The Duke of Edinburgh's Award. Its primary objective is to provide grants to assist young people with the costs of travel to Wild Country areas for expeditions, but it also provides financial assistance to leaders qualified as Award expedition trainers or assessors towards the cost of attending an appropriate First Aid course.

#### **Details:**

In support of young people undertaking DofE, the Lord-Lieutenant's Fund offers grants to DofE expedition supervisors or assessors actively working with DofE groups in the geographic area of Hampshire. The grants are towards the cost of specialist expedition first aid training only.

The applicant will need to hold the appropriate Operating Authority qualifications for a DofE expedition supervisor or assessor, and must confirm that they intend to support a Hampshire DofE group in the future.

The grant will be £30 and is dependent on passing the training. The number of grants available will be variable each year.

The application should be made before the start of the course, and the award of a grant will be confirmed shortly thereafter. The grant will be paid on receipt of a photocopy of the qualification certificate. Cheques will be payable to the applicant and sent to the address provided on the Application Form.
